If it helps you to frame your thoughts, consider the fingers on your hand.

The thumb points up, to God.

Pray your adoration, your thanks, your worship, to God. What do you praise Him for today?

The pointer finger teaches and directs.

Pray for wisdom and understanding.

Pray for the church: for pastors, leaders, and teachers; for all disciples of Jesus.

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Pray for counselors and therapists and chaplains, and for all those who are caring for others' emotional and mental health.

The middle finger is longest, tallest.

Pray for the powerful, those in authority.

Pray for our national leaders, state leaders, and local leaders.

Pray for those in the armed services, and for their families, especially in light of Memorial Day.

Pray for medical workers and experts, who are racing to find answers.

Pray for firefighters, EMT's, police officers, and all those who protect and serve and care.

The ring finger reminds us of our relationships.

Pray for those closest to you: family, friends, neighbors.

The pinky finger is smallest, weakest.

Pray for "the least of these," the vulnerable: the sick and the dying, the poor and the hungry, the elderly and the lonely, inmates and prisoners, etc.

Pray for all the ministries and missionaries who care for these people in God's love.

And, lastly, pray for yourself. Where do you feel weak today, in need of God's grace and power?

Close with the Lord's Prayer:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name.
Your kingdom come;
Your will be done on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are Yours now and forever.
Amen.
