Celebrating the Right Things

DISCIPLINE: CELEBRATION & HOSPITALITY

"Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.
"Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you shall be satisfied.
"Blessed are you who weep now, for you shall laugh."

Celebration is a vital discipline for disciples of Jesus and citizens of his kingdom. It makes the whole life he gives us vibrant with joy and energy and strength. But it requires *discipline* because we easily celebrate the wrong things.

"It is important to avoid the kind of celebrations that really celebrate nothing. Worse yet is to pretend to celebrate when the spirit of celebration is not in us."
