

The Bible Recap

"See, I will send the prophet Elijah to you before that great and dreadful day of the Lord comes. He will turn the hearts of the parents to their children, and the hearts of the children to their parents; or else I will come and strike the land with total destruction."

-Malachi 4:5-6

The Old Testament ends with a promise from God to send the prophet Elijah to His people in order to turn their hearts. As we begin the New Testament, we see John the Baptist coming to be the fulfillment of that prophecy.

"He will go on before the Lord, in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the father to their children and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous - to make ready a people prepared for the Lord." -Luke 1:17

John came to make the people's hearts ready for their Savior, Jesus Christ. For John it wasn't about getting praise, but pointing people to Christ, and it is the same for us today. People's hearts are still hard, and God has called us to point them to His Son.
