

The Bible Recap

Prodigal God

Prodigal: characterized by profuse or wasteful expenditure: lavish

The parable of the four soils, as it is often referred to, tells the story of a farmer spreading seed wherever it lands. Some fell on the path where birds ate it. Some fell in rocky soil where it could not take root. Some fell among weeds where it got choked out. But some fell on good soil where it produced a bountiful harvest. Jesus then explained to his disciples that God is the farmer, His word is the seed, and we humans are the soils. The way God's word affects our life shows what kind of soil we are.

But if we look at God, He doesn't seem to be a good farmer. Why would a farmer throw out seed wherever it might fall? Why wouldn't He just throw the seed onto good soil where He knows it will take root? God's word is not just for those who will accept it. It is for the whole world to hear. That is how much He cares for his creation. He gives everyone the chance to take His word and grow His fruit.

'Others, like seed sown on good soil, hear the word, accept it, and produce a crop—some thirty, some sixty, some a hundred times what was sown." -Mark 4:20
